IMPORTANT:

If your registration is restored, you must notify the Board if you are affected by any of the following :

- a change in your name (notification is required within 21 days and documentary evidence such as a **certified copy** of a marriage certificate must be supplied);
- a change in your address (notification is required within 21 days - this excludes a change of email address, which, while not required, would be appreciated);
- the withdrawal or cancellation of your qualification for registration (notification is required within 21 days);
- conviction for an indictable offence in Queensland or under a corresponding law (notification is required within 30 days);
- delivery of a judgement or settlement of proceedings if you are a party to proceedings in court claiming damages or compensation for alleged negligence by you or in the practice of your profession (notification is required within 30 days); OR
- cancellation, suspension, or application of a condition, undertaking or other disciplinary action to registration, licence or certification you hold under a corresponding law (notification is required within 30 days).
